Notes Plus



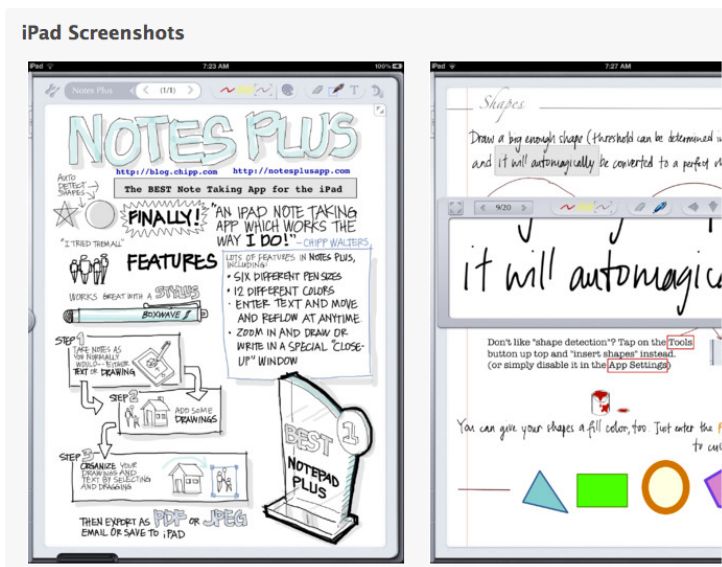

Use it with companion app, Skitch, from the same vendor to annotate files.

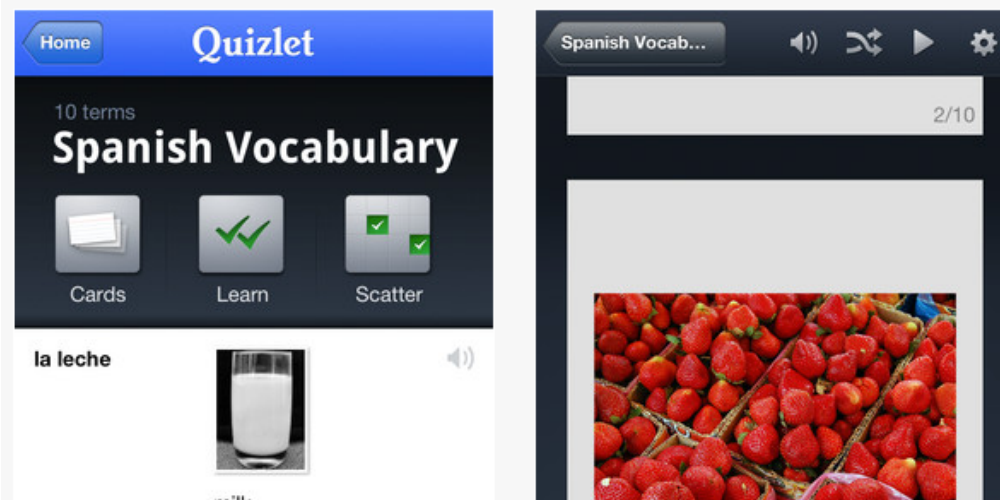
Quizlet

Good Reader and PDF MAX

Good Reader (\$4.99) and PDF Max (free) are tools for reading and annotating .pdf files.



Google Drive

Free: Allows you to access Google Drive files from your iPad. Note that you do not have full functionality. For some apps (e.g. Presentation), access is read-only. In other words, you can view files but not change them.
