Master of Music Education

A Three-term, Summer-intensive Professional Degree Program (30 credit hours)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Shenandoah Conservatory has served as a leader in music education since 1875. Our Master of Music Education degree is designed for the practicing music educator and features targeted study in pedagogy, scholarship and musicianship. The degree is uniquely designed to increase students' skills as reflective musician teachers. Part-time and summers-only programs of study are available to teachers who hold full-time teaching positions. The degree can be completed in three summers. Shenandoah Conservatory supports graduate study in music education through a substantial tuition discount.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Graduate Application for admission with a \$30 non-refundable application fee.
- Unofficial transcripts for initial admission from all institutions of higher education previously attended
- Baccalaureate degree* – a Bachelor of Music or the equivalent with a minimum GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale).
- Essay addressing your interest in the program and your professional goals (500 words).
- Curriculum Vitae/Resume.
 - o Must include at least one full year of teaching experience at elementary or secondary school levels in a private or public school.

*Most applicants present a baccalaureate degree in music education and are licensed teachers. Specific teacher licensure requirements are generally met through an approved undergraduate degree. Applicants who do not hold licensure may be admitted under special circumstances.

WHAT OUR STUDENTS LEARN

Music education is essential to the Conservatory's mission to provide musicians from the Commonwealth of Virginia and beyond with access to exceptional training. Students build on a solid foundation of experience while integrating theory and contemporary practice. The "summers-only" schedule allows practicing music educators to pursue a graduate degree during the summer months (mid-June to mid-July).

Music education students study assessment strategies, professional self-reflection of classroom practices, innovative curriculum and contemporary issues in music education. The program culminates with a research-based teaching project rather than a graduate thesis. Scholarly research unites the students' experience and the practice of teaching.

Classes are led by highly skilled master teachers who possess a breadth of experience in the classroom and the profession. Students gain professional insights as they interact with their music education colleagues in a tight-knit community.
