ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- I. Any transcript from a country outside of the U.S. must be **course-by-course** evaluated. An English translation will not be accepted in lieu of an evaluation. You can use any member of www.naces.org or www.aice-eval.org to evaluate your transcript(s). All associated fees are the responsibility of the applicant.
 - o [SpanTran](#) provides a customized application for SU applicants at a discount
- II. Official transcript(s) from all institutions of higher education where a degree was earned or relevant courses taken (even if an evaluation was completed)
 - o Please request your evaluating agency to include official transcript(s) with your evaluation
 - o Some organizations, such as SpanTran and ECE, provide official transcripts at no extra cost to the applicant
- III. Proof of English Language Proficiency
 - o Please see the back of this sheet for our detailed language proficiency policy
 - o Official score reports required for tests

COST AND AID

International Student

Required Tests

All applicants must meet language proficiency requirements and may need to submit official [TOEFL](#), [IELTS](#), [PTE](#) or [DET](#) test scores to demonstrate proof of English language proficiency.

Undergraduate: If you attend an English-based high school and are applying as a freshman, or as a transfer student who has completed less than 24 college credits and graduated from high school less than 2 years ago, you will be required to submit an SAT/ACT score. If you are applying as a transfer student with more than 24 credits completed you will not need to submit any test scores (with the exception of [transfer nursing programs](#)).

Graduate: Required tests vary by program. Please [contact us](#) for more details on your [program requirements](#).

If an applicant has not completed a high school diploma or post-secondary degree in one of the approved countries, language proficiency can be met by:

- Completion of the equivalent of Shenandoah's ENG 101 with of B or better at a regionally-accredited U.S.-based institution.
- Successful completion of Shenandoah University's IESL program
- Attain a minimum of one of the following test scores:
 - **480** or higher on the Evidence-based Reading and Writing (ERBW) section of the SAT (test must be taken within two years of submission).
 - **18** or higher on the English Composition section of the ACT (test must be taken within five years of submission).
 - **79** or higher on the TOEFL IBT for all programs, except those in the School of Nursing, School of Health Professions, and Music Therapy programs, for which an **83** or higher is required (the test must be taken within two years of submission).
 - **21** or higher on each section of the TOEFL Paper-delivered test for all programs, except those in the School of Nursing or School of Health Professions, for which a **24** or higher is required (test must be taken within two years of submission)
 - **6.5** or higher on the IELTS test for all programs except those in the School of Nursing or School of Health Profession which do not accept IELTS as proof of English proficiency (test must be taken within two years of submission).
 - **53** or higher on the PTE (Pearson Test of English) (test must be taken within two years of submission)
 - **55** or higher on 100-point scale (prior to July 15, 2019) or **105** or higher on new 160-point scale on the Duolingo English Test (DET) (test must be taken within two years of submission)
- For some graduate programs, including NonTraditional PharmD and Transitional Physical Therapy, Shenandoah University can hold a license as proof of English proficiency. Please visit the [admission pages](#) for more details.

CONDITIONAL ADMISSION

- Students who do not meet language proficiency requirements but have minimum scores of 45 on TOEFL, 5.0 on IELTS, 39 on PTE, or 31/100 or 75/160 on DET may be granted conditional admission
- Successful completion of Shenandoah University's [Intensive English as a Second Language](#) Program (IESL) is required for full admission to a program
 - You must apply to IESL and your selected program
 - You must be admitted to IESL before you can be considered for conditional admission to a program
 - If offered conditional admission, you must successfully complete IESL before starting program coursework the following semester.
