



## Online Graduate Certificate in Applied Behavior Analysis

The Applied Behavior Analysis program is specifically designed for individuals with a background in education, psychology or human services who are interested in becoming Board Certified Behavior Analysts. However, anyone with an interest in learning about interventions to produce lasting change in behavior will find this program to be extremely useful.

Our 21-credit, seven-course sequence is designed for people who seek advanced knowledge in the field of applied behavior analysis. The curriculum is intended to meet the BACB’s 5th Edition course work requirements and prepare students to sit for the 5th Edition BCBA certification examination. This program is for students who already hold a master’s degree or who are currently pursuing a master’s degree in another content or program area.

This online program is taught using a combination of synchronous and asynchronous classes so that students get to know their instructors and their peers.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Graduate Application for Admission along with a \$30 non-refundable application fee
- Master’s Degree (minimum 3.0 GPA)
  - Background in psychology, education, or human services is recommended, but not required
- Unofficial transcripts for initial admission from all institutions of higher education previously attended
- Essay addressing the applicant’s reason for applying to the Applied Behavior Analysis program, including what factors influenced the decision and how this program will help the individual to reach professional goals
- Three letters of recommendation written by professors, supervisors, or other persons engaged in the practice of Applied Behavior Analysis or other human services professions
- Language Proficiency Requirement must be met. Submission of TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, or Duolingo English Test may be required. See our policy for full details: <https://www.su.edu/admissions/international-students>
